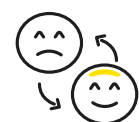

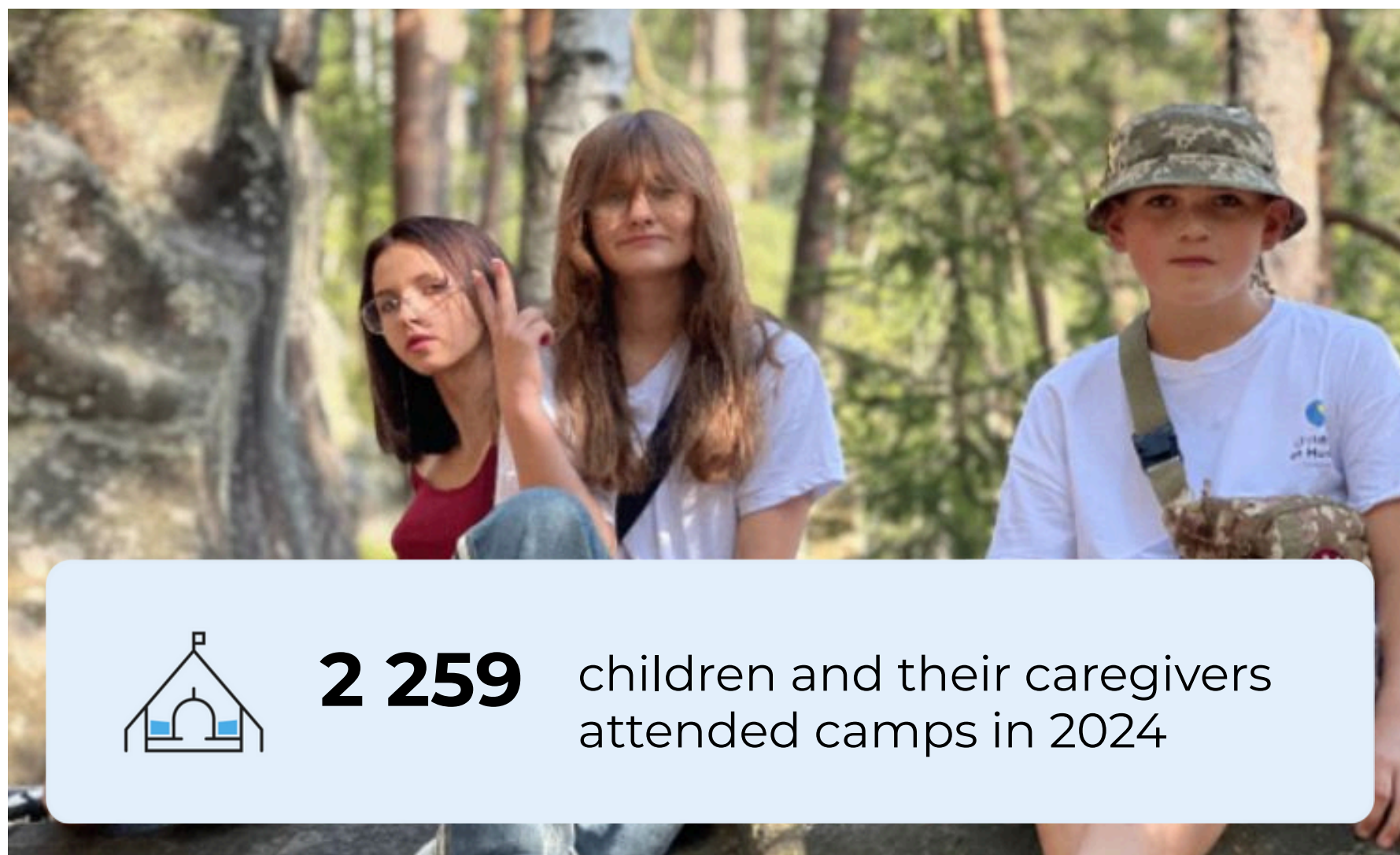

COMPREHENSIVE SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN, FAMILIES, AND COMMUNITIES AFFECTED BY THE WAR

On 21 November 2025, a kick-off meeting for the project «Comprehensive support for children, families, and communities affected by the war» took place in Kyiv. The project is implemented with the financial support of the EU and the Representation of the International Solidarity Fund in Ukraine.

The project is carried out with the financial support of the EU and aims to introduce a sustainable system of psychosocial assistance in Ukraine. It envisages the creation of eight psychosocial support centers in the Dnipropetrovsk and Odesa regions, which will provide around 2 500 rehabilitation services every month. It also involves the organization of educational and rehabilitation camps for more than 3 500 young people and educators from frontline areas.

CAMPS 2026 FOR CHILDREN OF HEROES



Our partners at CITI have provided extremely important support to the Children of Heroes Fund in the amount of nearly USD 150,000.

These funds will be used to implement the TAVRA program in 2026. The program is a key initiative aimed at the psychological rehabilitation of children who have experienced loss due to war. It combines recreation, emotional support, and work with specialists to help children recover.

This funding will create a safe space for their development and recovery. CITI's support is a significant contribution to the future of children who most need care and attention.

EXHIBITION AS PART OF THE «YELLOW AND BLUE BUTTERFLIES» EVENT IN TALLINN



An international event called «Yellow and Blue Butterflies» was held in Tallinn, dedicated to Ukrainian children who suffered from the war and were illegally taken out of Ukraine. As part of this initiative, the Children of Heroes Charitable Fund held its own exhibition of children's drawings, «Colors That Bring Life Back,» introducing guests to the works of the fund's wards who lost one or both parents due to the war. Dmytro Lubinets, the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights, also addressed the participants of the event. He emphasized that Russia's war against Ukraine is taking away children's homes, parents, and sense of security, and therefore protecting children's rights and restoring their normal childhood must be a priority for the entire international community. Through joint efforts, in particular with the help of the Estonian state and the international community, we will do everything possible to ensure that every Ukrainian child who has experienced deportation and loss can return home. They will feel that their life has color again.

Artem, 13 years old

The boy lives with his mother in a small town in the Odesa region. His mother works as an accountant, has a disability status and chronic illnesses, yet every day she fights for her family and supports Artem in everything he does. Artem is in the 8th grade and is very eager to grow: he studies English and programming. Despite a congenital heart defect and blood pressure issues, he remains active, curious, and determined.

Artem's family has gone through a painful loss — his father, a reconnaissance officer, was killed on 23 November last year while on duty in Toretsk. His father was a true Hero, and the memory of him continues to inspire Artem and the whole family. That is why, when a memorial stele with his father's name was recently unveiled in their town, Artem, and his mother took part in the ceremony with pride and deep emotion.

Artem and his family have received significant support from charitable organizations, including the Children of Heroes Charity Fund: a device for studying, a first aid kit, clothing, shoes, hygiene and food packages, stationery, and much more. This assistance has become an important source of support for the family in their daily life and in Artem's education. Despite all the challenges, Artem remains cheerful, dreams about the future, and continues moving confidently toward his goals.



The most significant support programs at present are:

Education and development.

This program gives children the opportunity to realize their potential even in the most difficult circumstances.

Family assistants are specialists from the Fund who provide daily support to families in difficult life circumstances.
