


«BEING THERE: HOW TO UNDERSTAND YOUR CHILD WITHOUT LOSING YOURSELF»

In February, we launched a mini-course for caregivers titled «Being There: How to Understand Your Child Without Losing Yourself.» Four out of five lectures have already taken place, covering the following topics:

1. Adolescence without panic;
2. How not to lose connection with your child;
3. Emotional regulation for teenagers during stress and loss;
4. Boundaries without shouting or punishment.

It is about healthy boundaries as a source of safety, not rigidity. About how to say «no» without damaging the relationship or losing authority. So that there is more stability and support within the family.

The lecture is delivered by a specialist from our team of psychologists, Alona Buchuchanu.

«A NEW YEAR'S MIRACLE» FROM BAYER

Thanks to this support, many of the Foundation's beneficiaries received holiday surprises that brought them joy and a sense of wonder.

For many children, this gift became an especially meaningful sign of care during the holiday season. We are sincerely grateful to Bayer for its attention to the children, their emotions, and their festive spirit.



As part of the fourth anniversary of the start of Russia's full-scale invasion, the Ukrainian Institute of America hosted an open house event, «Feel Ukraine,» to highlight why Ukrainians continue to defend their heritage and homeland.

An important part of the event featured drawings by the Fund's beneficiaries. These are patriotic-themed artworks created by children both before and after the full-scale invasion.

The children's drawings honestly show how war changes even the youngest lives. Bright colors give way to darker imagery, and fairy-tale scenes are replaced by the reality of loss, fear, and pain. Each drawing is a testament to what these children have seen and felt. This is not simply children's art — it is a visual diary of lived experience.

Danylo is 18, Kateryna is 14, Kira is 10, and Amina is 5 years old.

Anna moved with her children from Donetsk Oblast to Ivano-Frankivsk Oblast to escape the war. Her husband took the family to a safer place and then returned to the front to defend Ukraine. During a combat mission, he was injured by a landmine. After treatment and rehabilitation, he decided to return to the front line and rejoin his brothers-in-arms. There, while serving his country, he tragically died in a road accident. Anna works as a housekeeper. Her older children continue studying online at their school in Donetsk Oblast, while her youngest daughter, Amina, only recently started kindergarten. Kira and Kateryna are very talented at drawing, and Danylo loves fishing. Anna's eldest son is also defending Ukraine.

During their time with the Fund, the family received various types of support, including food and hygiene kits, clothing and shoes for all the children, New Year gifts, compensation for firewood, gadgets, and more.



The most significant support programmes at present are:

Education and development.

This programme gives children the opportunity to realise their potential even in the most difficult circumstances.

The Psychological Support and Socialisation programme is delivered by the Fund's team of specialists, who provide daily psychological support to beneficiaries and their guardians.
