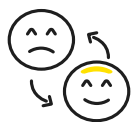

The Children of Heroes Fund runs a socialisation programme in which camps play a central role. The camp programme helps children who have experienced loss build resilience, develop social skills, and strengthen their self-esteem. Residential camps offer a change of environment and a structured space for physical, emotional, and social recovery.

THE «DREAM» PROJECT: AN INVESTMENT IN THE FUTURE

Six teenagers under the care of the Children of Heroes Fund travelled from Ukraine to the United States for a two-week educational journey designed to immerse them in the systems, conversations and environments that shape global leadership.

The teenagers visited some of the world's leading institutions in Boston, Washington, DC, New Jersey, and New York. The value of this experience went beyond the prestige of the institutions themselves. The children attended lectures, took part in discussions, spoke directly with professors and researchers, and explored universities as intellectual ecosystems. Most importantly, they entered these spaces as active participants.

The «Dream» project once again shows that one of the strongest investments we can make is an investment in the education, experience and future of Ukraine's children.



PSYCHOLOGICAL RECOVERY PROJECT



In April, the first of three planned cohorts began as part of Terra Heroica, a project implemented by the Children of Heroes Fund under the programme «Comprehensive Support for Children, Families and Communities Affected by the War.»

During the programme, children received comprehensive psychological support, including group and individual consultations, art therapy, and evening activities with elements of psychological rehabilitation. The programme also included concerts, parties, excursions and sports activities.

The main achievement of Terra Heroica was a significant improvement in participants' emotional wellbeing. This was confirmed by diagnostic assessment results, which showed a shift from medium or reduced indicators to high levels of emotional wellbeing, as well as by feedback from guardians.



Since the start of the partnership with CHER'17, the total amount of support has exceeded UAH 5.5 million. Since the beginning of this year alone, the brand's charitable initiatives have directed more than UAH 1 million to children who have lost one or both parents because of the war in Ukraine.

These contributions help the Fund respond more quickly to families' needs, including psychological support, education programmes, humanitarian kits, medical needs and other essential requests.

For children, this means more stability in everyday life: the opportunity to continue learning, receive timely support and gradually rebuild a sense of safety, continuity and a future of their own.

Daniil, 8 years old

Before the war, Daniil lived with his mother, Nataliia, and father, Oleksandr, in Odesa, on the grounds of a military unit. His father served in the Armed Forces of Ukraine, his mother took care of the home, and their son was growing up surrounded by love and safety. After the start of the full-scale war, everything changed. The family was evacuated, and later Nataliia received the most devastating news: Oleksandr had been killed during shelling in Vasytkiv before medical help could reach him.

With the support of the Children of Heroes Fund and caring people, the family was able to furnish a rented flat and restore a sense of home. The Fund, together with its partners, covered the individual speech therapy sessions Daniil needed, which gave his speech development a significant boost. The Fund also supported the family with humanitarian aid, professional psychological support and medical insurance for Daniil.



The most significant support programmes at present are:

Education and development.

This programme gives children the opportunity to realise their potential even in the most difficult circumstances.

Psychological support and socialisation is one of the Fund's core areas of work, helping families access psychological care and ensuring they do not have to face loss alone.
