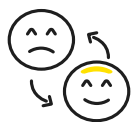

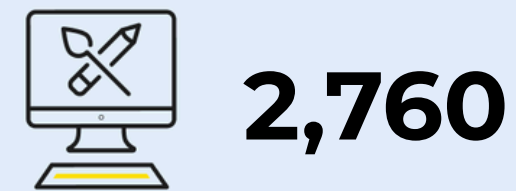

The Children of Heroes Fund runs a socialisation programme in which camps play a central role. The camp programme helps children who have experienced loss build resilience, develop social skills, and strengthen their self-esteem. Residential camps offer a change of environment and a structured space for physical, emotional, and social recovery.

Thanks to the support and funding from Crédit Agricole Bank, we ran three sessions of psychological recovery camps for children who have lost one or both parents due to the war. In total, 220 beneficiaries of the Fund took part.

The children worked with psychologists and took part in group and individual activities focused on overcoming loss, anxiety, and stress. Connecting with peers who share similar experiences proved equally important — for many, it was the first time they felt they were not alone with their pain.

Parents and guardians noted positive changes after the camps: children became more open, more confident, and more willing to engage with others. Many began to talk more easily about their experiences.



In May 2026, Olha Diakun and Oleksandra Poloskova, fundraisers at the Children of Heroes Charity Fund, successfully completed the four-day Fundraising NGO Growth Lab training programme, organised by Razom for Ukraine in collaboration with the Institute of Leadership and Management at the Ukrainian Catholic University (UCU) in Lviv.

The programme was designed to strengthen organisational capacity and develop a systematic approach to fundraising.

Participation in the programme provided the foundation's team with new practical tools to develop their fundraising system, strengthen partnerships, and increase the effectiveness of resource mobilisation to support children who have lost one or both parents due to the war.





«CHILDREN OF HEROES» — PART OF AN INTERNATIONAL CONSORTIUM SUPPORTED BY THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION

«Children of Heroes» has joined the international consortium of the RE:U-GEN project—Resilience and Empowerment: Generation Narratives—funded by the European Commission under the CERV-2025-CHILD program. The project launched on February 2, 2026, and will run for 24 months (until February 2028).

The consortium is coordinated by the Hungarian organization Hungarian Interchurch Aid (HIA). Partners span five countries: Hungary, Ukraine, Romania, Greece, and Latvia.

The project's goal is to provide Ukrainian children and adolescents affected by war and forced displacement with the opportunity to develop digital storytelling skills, build resilience, and interact safely in the online environment.

In May, 45 teenagers completed the Promind Mental Development Courses across three groups of 15. Six sessions were held throughout the course.

«BeBrave: Your Name Is Your Brand»

For teens aged 12–17 who want to present themselves confidently, build their own brand, and handle any life situation through the art of self-presentation.

«Emotional GPS: A Guide to Understanding Yourself»

For children aged 10–14 who want to better understand their emotions, manage them more effectively, and improve their relationships with others.

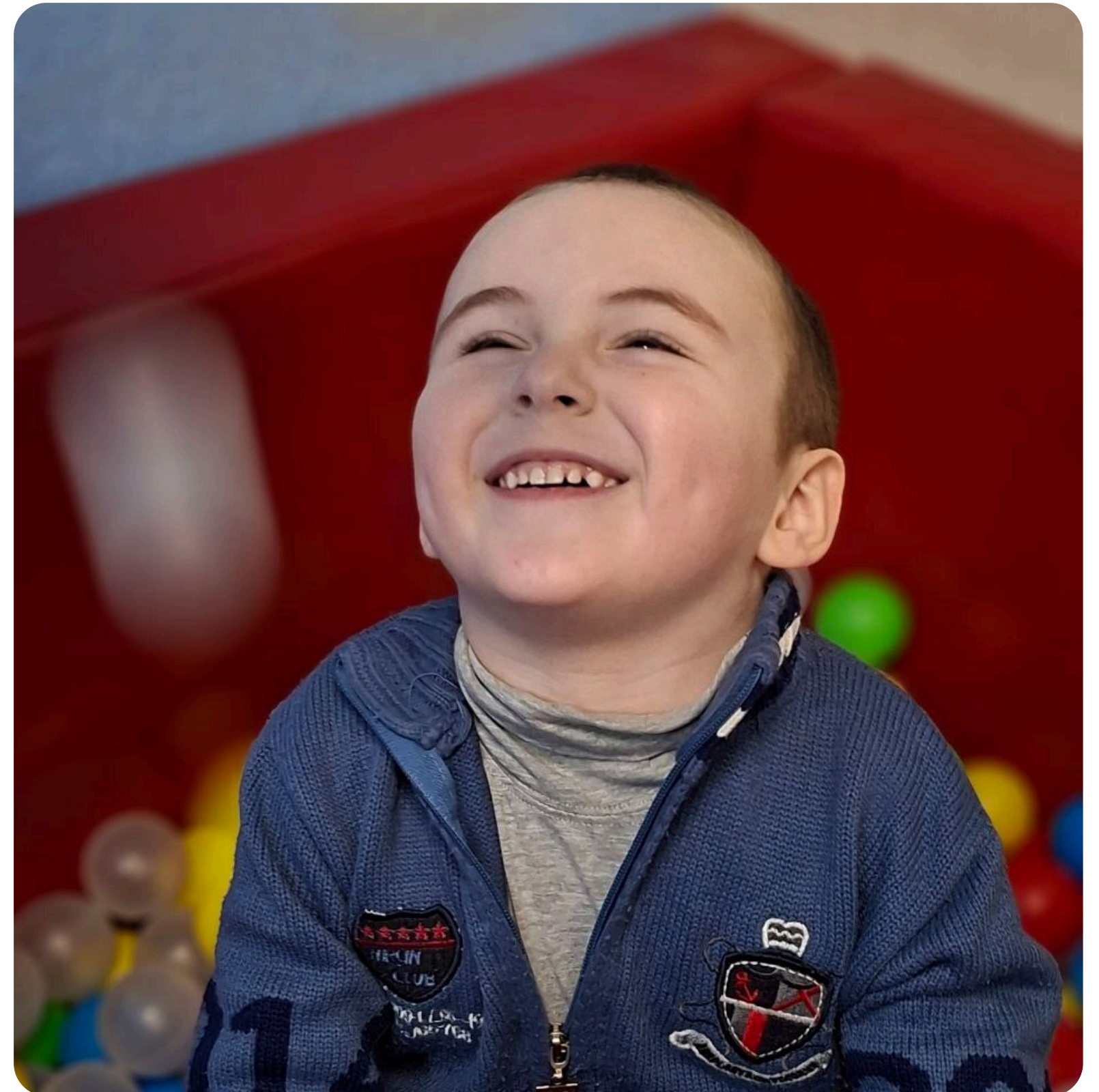
«Resilience Made Easy: How to Build a Life on Your Own Terms»

For teens aged 14–17 who want to feel confident, manage stress, set boundaries, and build emotional resilience.

Kuzma, 4 years old

Kuzma's father went missing in 2023 in the Zaporizhzhia region while performing duties related to the defence of Ukraine. The family has had no news of him since. Kuzma has special needs (autism) and the status of a child with a disability. His mother has left work to care for him full-time and manage his daily rehabilitation.

Every month, Kuzma attends sessions with a psychologist, speech therapist, ABA therapist, and sensory integration specialist — at a cost of approximately 7,500 UAH per month, which is a significant burden for a family without stable income. With support from the Fund and its partners, Kuzma received funding for rehabilitation and was able to continue his regular sessions at the development centre.



The most significant support programmes at present are:

Education and development.

This programme gives children the opportunity to realise their potential even in the most difficult circumstances.

Psychological support and socialisation is one of the Fund's core areas of work, helping families access psychological care and ensuring they do not have to face loss alone.
