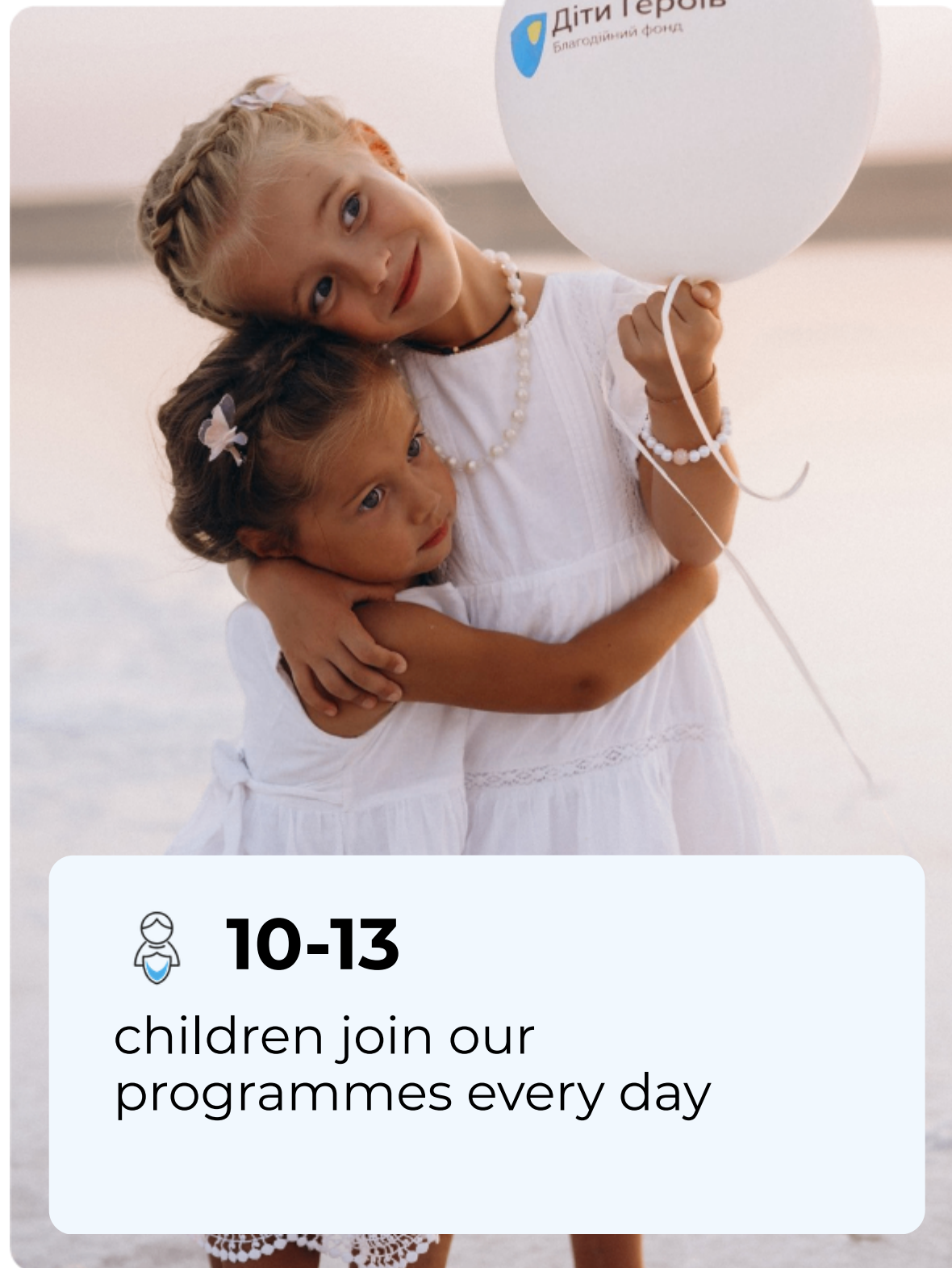

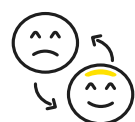

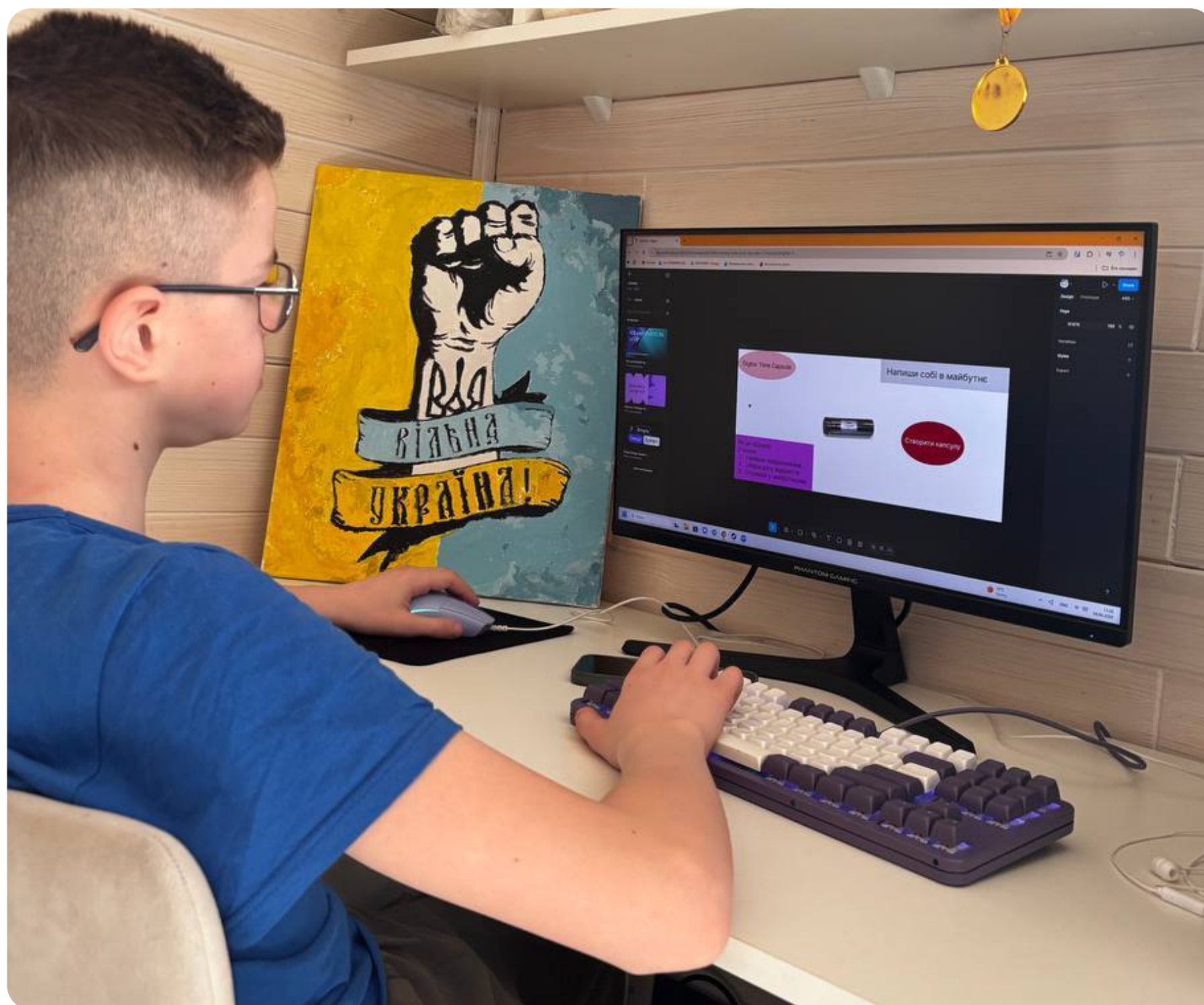

SOCIALISATION PROGRAMME — CAMPS

The Children of Heroes Fund runs a socialisation programme in which camps play a central role. The camp programme helps children who have experienced loss build resilience, develop social skills, and strengthen their self-esteem. Residential camps offer a change of environment and a structured space for physical, emotional, and social recovery.

In June 2026, the «Oleina for Children. Cooking with Love» project marked its second anniversary. Over these two years, the cooking masterclasses have become a regular space for support, connection, and new skills for the children in the care of the Children of Heroes Charity Fund

Thanks to the brand's sustained support, the following has been made possible:

- over 29,000 lessons in English, Ukrainian, and mathematics;
- 358 psychological counselling sessions;
- 240 children at the Svitlyachok recovery camp;
- 40 cooking masterclasses;
- over 400 winter clothing vouchers;
- over 850 New Year and Christmas gifts.

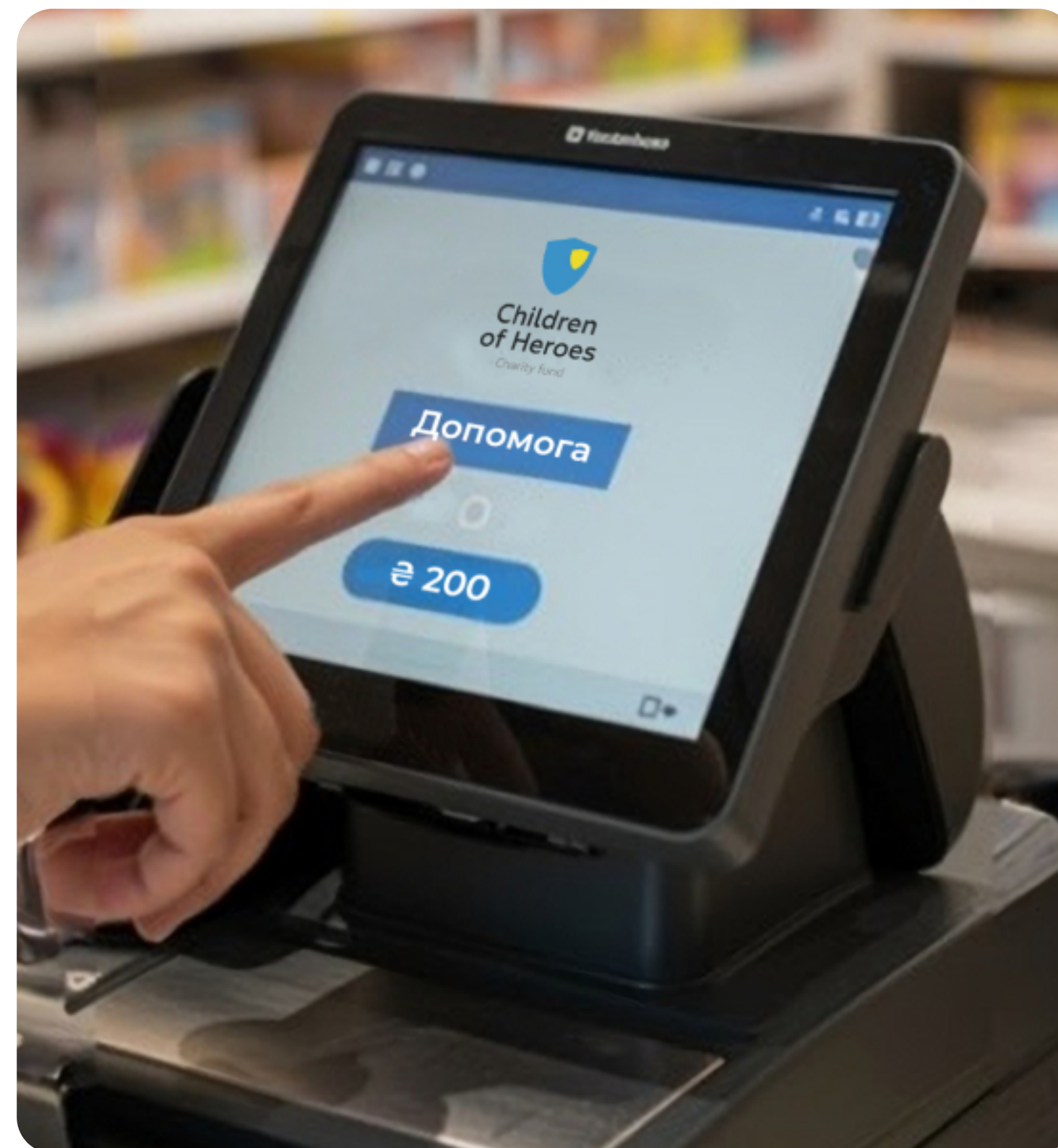
Two years of partnership show that long-term cooperation between a business and a charity can create lasting programmes, not one-off initiatives.



On 15 November 2024, the Antoshka children's store chain and the Children of Heroes Charity Fund began a long-term partnership in support of children who have lost parents to the war. Through this cooperation, Antoshka stores raise funds for the needs of the Fund's beneficiaries.

Anyone can take part: when shopping at any store in the chain, customers can add an amount of their choice to their receipt. To date, Antoshka has donated over UAH 5.5 million to the Fund.

The initiative was made possible by the social responsibility of the Antoshka brand, for which it matters not only to sell children's products but also to support the children who need it most.



AN EDUCATIONAL DAY CAMP FOR CHILDREN

In June, a session of the «Drive the Future Camp» took place. This is a day camp with an educational focus for children. The Fund ran the project together with the Junior Academy of Sciences, with financial support from AVT Bavaria. The camp's programme centred on exploring the environment. The children explained natural phenomena through science, ran experiments, and carried out hands-on investigations.

The camp day ran from 9:00 to 18:00. Alongside the practical sessions, participants had a full excursion programme across the VDNG grounds. They visited the Museum of Mathematics and the greenhouse complexes. Thanks to the project's sponsor, the children also visited the car museum and learned more about BMW. Twice a day, they were provided with balanced meals.



Anastasiia, 16 years old

Anastasiia's family is going through a difficult time. The girl's father went missing while carrying out a combat mission, and this has been a hard ordeal for the whole family. Despite everything, they are holding together.

Anastasiia is 16. She is creative and determined, has an interest in the beauty industry, and dreams of becoming a make-up artist. The family have completed a course of sessions with a psychologist, and this support became an important resource for them during a hard period. They say the sessions helped them grow emotionally stronger.

The Fund also gave the family a hygiene kit. This helped cover their basic household needs and ease their day-to-day expenses.



The most significant support programmes at present are:

Education and development.

This programme gives children the opportunity to realise their potential even in the most difficult circumstances.

Psychological support and socialisation is one of the Fund's core areas of work, helping families access psychological care and ensuring they do not have to face loss alone.
