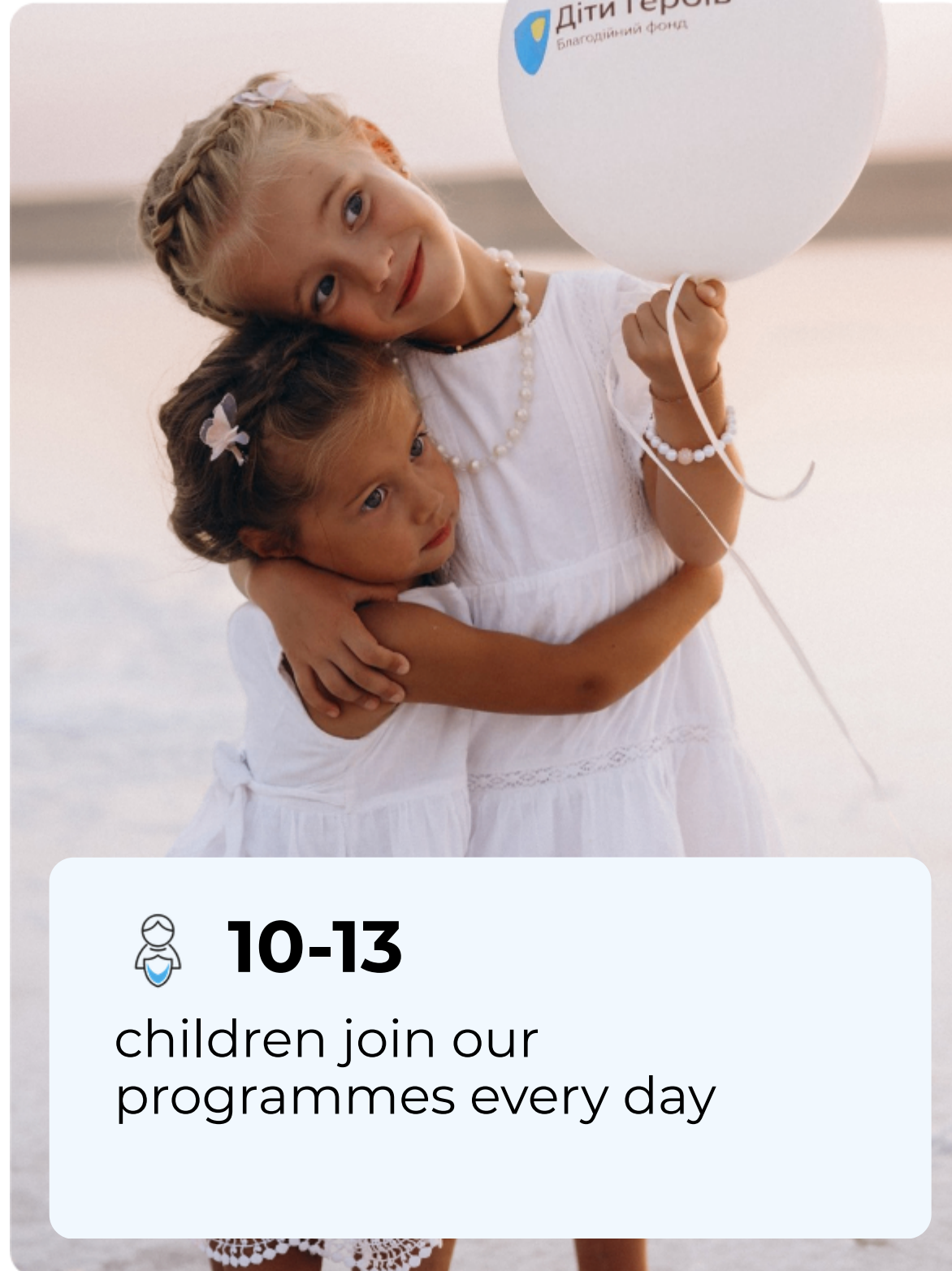

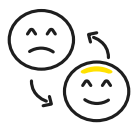

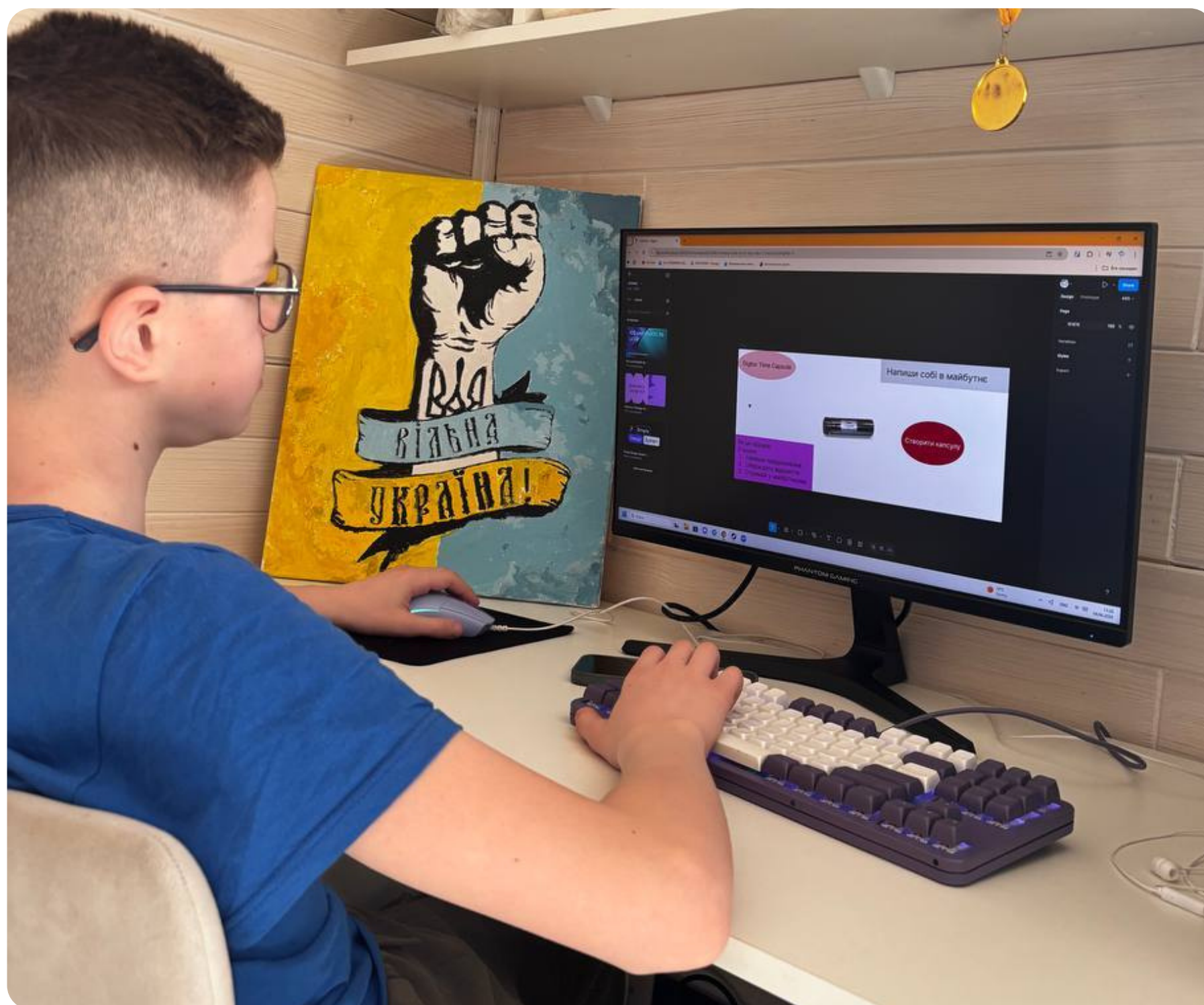

SOCIALISATION PROGRAMME — CAMPS

The Children of Heroes Fund runs a socialisation programme in which camps play a central role. The camp programme helps children who have experienced loss build resilience, develop social skills and strengthen their self-esteem. Residential camps offer a change of environment and a structured space for physical, emotional and social recovery.

A SPACE FOR MEANINGFUL CONVERSATIONS

In July, three online sessions were held by our partner UA Mental Help as part of our ongoing collaboration:

One lecture for adults — «Parenting: where to find the strength when proper rest isn't an option?» The session covered ways to support yourself, restore your inner resources and find energy at times when full rest simply isn't available.

Two online sessions for children aged 8–10 and 11–13, run as a quest called «A Safe Space». Along the way, participants learned about non-violent communication, children's rights and ways to protect them, the basics of cyber security, skills for looking after their mental health, and how to deal with bullying, conflict and respect for others. The format combined interactive tasks and quizzes with real-life scenarios, where children worked out safe solutions and put their own knowledge to the test.

In total, the sessions were attended by 8 adults and 51 children.

AN INFORMED CHOICE ABOUT THE FUTURE

In the summer of 2026, the Children of Heroes Charity Fund, together with the National University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy and Deloitte Ukraine, ran a three-day intensive in financial literacy and career guidance for teenagers.

The programme combined:

- teaching from university lecturers and industry experts;
- an introduction to student life;
- practical case studies from Deloitte;
- conversations with working professionals;
- the development of financial thinking skills.

We ran a survey following the intensive — over 150 applications in just two days. Teenagers need first-hand experience: to get a feel for student life, to spend time inside a university and inside a company's offices. That is what makes an informed choice of profession possible, rather than one driven by fear.



«SUCCESS» HEALTH AND RECREATION CAMP

In July, a session of the «Success» health and recreation camp took place, run in partnership with the international charitable foundation Board: Stronger Together.

Sixty children aged 11 to 16 spent a week on the shore of the Shatsk Lakes. Each day of the session had its own theme: Film Day, Talent Day, Success Day, Foreign Languages Day. Within each day, the programme kept a balance between lectures from the camp leaders and guest speakers, hands-on sessions and time to rest. There was swimming in the lakes and sports competitions every day, with entertainment in the evenings.

The format works on two fronts at once: physical recovery, and keeping children engaged with learning during the months when the school routine is on pause.



Thanks to the support of our partner Rabobank, we were able to give children new opportunities for development, learning and memorable experiences. The partnership enabled 60 children to attend the «Strength Within You» camp. For them, it was a time of new friendships, engaging activities, teamwork and discovering their own strengths. The children were given a space where they could rest, express themselves and feel supported.

In addition, thanks to Rabobank, nine months of English language lessons will be covered for 52 children. This is an opportunity to improve their knowledge and broaden their horizons, so they can look to the future with greater confidence. Regular lessons help children develop their language skills and maintain an interest in learning.

We are sincerely grateful to Rabobank for the partnership and for their contribution to children's development.

This family from Khmelnytskyi was waiting for two things at once — the birth of a third child and their father's return from service. In October 2025, he was killed in the line of duty, without ever meeting his newborn daughter. Their mother is now raising three children on her own. A lengthy investigation and delays in state payments left the family without a stable income for a period of time.

The Fund continues to work alongside them. The family has received legal advice, food and hygiene products, clothing for the children, baby food, nappies, first-aid kits and vitamins, and 15,000 UAH in financial support, among other assistance.

No less important for their mother is the human side of that support — being able to stay in contact with a Fund specialist and to know that she is not on her own during a difficult period.



The most significant support programmes at present are:

Education and development.

This programme gives children the opportunity to realise their potential even in the most difficult circumstances.

Psychological and socialisation

is one of the Fund's core areas of work, helping families access psychological care and ensuring they do not have to face loss alone.
